PLAINTIFF’S SECOND AFFIDAVIT IN SUPPORT OF SECOND MOTION FOR TEMPORARY RESTRAINING ORDER

Plaintiff, Jeffrey A. Dickstein hereby submits the following affidavit in support of his motion for a temporary restraining order.

1. My name is Jeffrey A. Dickstein. I am more than 18 years old and make this affidavit on personal knowledge. If called as a witness, I could, and would, testify thereto.
2. I not only have read, but authorED the Complaint for Injunctive and Declaratory Relief filed concurrently herewith, and the same is true and correct to the best of my knowledge.
3. I was required to wear a mask to enter the courthouse to file these documents, to enter several facilities to purchase a fuse for my home fuse box, to Kinko’s to make copies, and to buy groceries at Reasor’s and several trips to QuikTrip. In fact, this Court’s clerk, knowing full well the ordinance is unconstitutional and void, would not hand me the Court’s order denying the original motion for TRO. Hence irreparable injury complained of has already occurred, and will continue to occur in every establishment in the City of Tulsa until enjoined.
4. On July 21, 2020, at 8:30 a.m. I called the City Attorneys Office at (918) 596-7717. I advised the receptionist who answered the phone I was calling to give notice regarding a hearing on my emergency motion for TRO. The receptionist had no knowledge of what I was

attempting to accomplish and transferred me to Julie. Julie also had no knowledge of what I was attempting to accomplish and was advised a City Attorney would call me. As of 11:41 a.m. this date, no such phone call has been received.

5. Accordingly, I have personally served the Office of the City Attorney, located at 175 E 2nd St, Tulsa OK with copies of the following documents on or before 3:00 p.m. this date:

- a. **PLAINTIFF'S SECOND EMERGENCY MOTION FOR TEMPORARY RESTRAINING ORDER, WITH NOTICE; FOR PRELIMINARY INJUNCTION; MEMORANDUM OF POINTS AND AUTHORITIES;**
- b. **PLAINTIFF'S REQUEST FOR COURT TO SET A HEARING DATE FOR PLAINTIFF'S EMERGENCY MOTION FOR PRELIMINARY INJUNCTION;**
- c. **PLAINTIFF'S PROPOSED ORDER SETTING HEARING ON PLAINTIFF'S EMERGENCY MOTION FOR PRELIMINARY INJUNCTION;**
- d. **PLAINTIFF'S REQUEST FOR COURT TO TAKE JUDICIAL NOTICE OF ADJUDICATIVE FACTS;**
- e. **THE ORIGINAL COMPLAINT FILED JULY 17, 2020;**
- f. **THIS AFFIDAVIT.**

6. In an abundance of caution Plaintiff also attempted to notify the State Attorney General of my intent to appear for a hearing on my Second Emergency Motion for TRO. On July 21, 2020 at 8:42 a.m. I called (405) 521-3921. The receptionist who answered the phone transferred me to Laura Williamson whose voice mail advised she was only in the office on Mondays and Wednesdays and to leave a message. I left a message advising I was going to appear before Judge Musseman in Courtroom 706 of the Tulsa County Courthouse on July 22, 2020 at 1:30 p.m.
